HIRS LEAFLET LIST

NHS INFORM: BROWSEALOUD TRANSLATION FUNCTION

Please note that the option for language translation within NHS inform is no longer available. NHS24 reports that the language translation function utilises Google Translate, so a guarantee cannot be given on the accuracy of the translations provided. Given that the majority of NHS inform content is clinically sensitive, the decision was taken to remove the translation function as it poses a potential clinical risk.

NHS24 is currently conducting an evaluation of the Browsealoud tool, and a decision around translation of content is expected to be made afterwards.

- Please note that the 'HEPATITIS B IMMUNISATION: FOR BABIES BORN TO MOTHERS WITH
 HEPATITIS B' title has been revised and should only be used for babies born to mothers with Hepatitis
 B. New copies should be ordered via HIRS and older copies binned/replaced. For Hepatitis B
 immunisation (i.e. the 6-in-1 vaccine), which is given as part of the routine schedule, the relevant
 information is covered in the universal 'A guide to childhood immunisations up to 5 years of
 age' booklet.
- We have also been notified that the 'HAPPY, HEALTHY KIDS' (healthy weight) title is under revision at this time.
